As we enter the fourth year in the new Town Hall/Fire Station/Community Center building it has proved to be a desired place for 4-H Clubs, Lions Club, Snow Mobile Club, Scouts and many other community events in the Garth P. Ryder Community Hall throughout the year.

A Message from the Pleasant Valley Firefighters

Did you know that home fires are more likely to occur in the winter months than any other time of the year?

The Pleasant Valley Fire Department offers a few tips to help keep your home safe this winter:

- -Replace smoke alarm and CO (carbon monoxide) batteries annually and test alarms at least once a month
- -Keep items that may burn at least three feet away from furnaces, fireplaces, portable space heaters, and other heating equipment
- -Never use your oven to heat your home
- -Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed
- -Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned yearly by a qualified professional
- -Have a CO monitor installed in a central location in your home
- -Keep Fire numbers clear of snow and visible from the road

Stay warm this winter, but be sure to keep high heat in its place. It only takes a couple of minutes for a fire to become life-threatening.



CARE TO SERVE YOUR COMMUNITY?

Volunteer firefighting is a rewarding and valuable way to serve your community. It takes dedication and many hours of training to become a firefighter. If you're over 18 and are willing to put in the time and effort, the Pleasant Valley Fire Department would be grateful for your support. Firefighters meet the first and third Monday of each month at 6:30 p.m. at the Cleghorn Station for training/meetings. Snow Removal, Safety and Town Right-of-Way

'Tis the season of snow removal. WI Stat. 346.94(5) states that no person may place or cause to be placed upon any highway any substance that is or may be injurious to any vehicle. This includes piles of snow. Please do not place any snow from your driveway anywhere within the road right of way. For safety reasons, our plow drivers will issue warnings followed by citations if this is a problem on your property.

Please do not let children build tunnels or play on the snow plow piles left in the town right-of-ways. Our plow crews can be out any time of the day or night clearing roads, widening roadways or cleaning cul-de-sacs. At times, the plow drivers have limited visibility and may not see your children. Children playing in or near the snowbanks can be seriously injured or killed.

For your own safety, please make sure your fire number signs are always visible to the roadway. Emergency personnel rely on these signs to expedite emergency services to you and your property. With heavy snowfall, it is easy for signs to become buried. If you fire number sign has aged and become difficult to read, you can order a new sign for \$25. Garbage cans continue to be a problem on our road right of ways. If it is your garbage day, make sure your garbage can and recycling bin are located on your property and off of the road right-of-way, which is typically 33 ft. from the center line. Placing your bins across the road from your driveway poses a hazard for traffic and makes the plowing efforts more difficult. Thank you for you cooperation with these matters.

Dog Licenses Required Annually



WI Statute 174.05 states the owner of any dog five months of age or older shall annually on or before the first day of January apply for a license from the Town Treasurer.

If you licensed your dog in 2018, in early December you will receive a blue postcard with your dog's information printed on it reminding you to license your dog in 2019. Current rabies information from your vet must be included with your application. If you did not receive a postcard, but own a dog, you can print an application at www.townofpleasantvalley.com under forms and permits or contact the town office at (715)878-4645.

Fines and court costs for keeping an unlicensed dog can approach \$275. Make sure your dog is licensed!

Valley as the home for SnowBiz and the Starfest Telethon.


