2021 Town Updates

Greetings from the Town of Pleasant Valley Board. Here are a few highlights from 2021 that occurred in our Town:

- With the 2020 census information, the Town has now been split into two different County Supervisor Districts. The northern two-thirds of the Town will remain in District 7 and their supervisor will also serve a small portion of the Town of Washington. The southern third of the Town will be a part of District 5 and their supervisor will also serve a large portion of the County to the east. Maps can be viewed on the County webpage.
- The Town population has grown 25% in the last ten years. In 2010 the population was 3044 and is currently 3791.
- With the current low interest rates, the Town Board refinanced the Community Center/Town Hall/Fire Station building loan. The accrued savings for the remainder of the loan total \$137,644.
- The revaluation is complete. The total value of the Town of Pleasant Valley increased to \$501,717,400 which is an increase of 39%. The net result of an increase in total value is a lower mill rate.
- The Town has applied for a 90/10 matching grant from the State of Wisconsin to receive funding for over three miles of road. If the grant is received sections of Maple, Cedar and Balsam roads will be reconstructed.

We hope 2021 has been good to you and wish you a healthy and prosperous 2022.




All elections are held at the Town Hall/Fire Station in Cleghorn from 7am - 8pm.

Annual Reminders Worth Repeating...

2021 Tax Bills - Payable in 2022

- First payment must be postmarked by January 31 and received by February 7 (USPS delivery only).
- To avoid late mail delivery, a locked drop box is located at the Town Hall for your convenience. Due Date: Jan 31.
- First payment is payable to: Town of Pleasant Valley, S10414 Cty Rd HHI in Cleghorn.
- Make sure to include the payment stub from the tax bill so the correct property is credited.
- One check can be written for multiple properties.
- Receipts will **ONLY** be mailed to you if you enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope with your payment.

- View and print your tax bill online after the mill rates are submitted in early December.
- Check to see if your personal or escrow payment has been received and print a receipt for your records.

- Hint: When using the property search feature—Only use the fields with the municipality name and your last name.

Dog Licenses Required Annually



WI Statute 174.05 states the owner of any dog five months of age or older shall annually on or before the first day of January apply for a license from the Town Treasurer.

If you licensed your dog in 2021 in early December you will receive a large postcard with your dog's information printed on it reminding you to license your dog in 2022. Current rabies information from your vet must be included with your application. If you did not receive a postcard, but own a dog, you can print an application at townofpleasantvalley.com under forms and permits or contact the town office at (715)878-4645.

Fines and court costs for keeping an unlicensed dog can approach \$275. Make sure your dog is licensed!

Snow Removal, Safety and Town Right-of-Way

'Tis the season of snow removal. WI Stat. 346.94(5) states that no person may place or cause to be placed upon any highway any substance that is or may be injurious to any vehicle. This includes piles of snow. Please do not place any snow from your driveway anywhere within the road right of way. For safety reasons, our plow drivers will issue warnings followed by citations if this is a problem on your property.

Please do not let children build tunnels or play on the snow plow piles left in the town right of ways. Our plow crews can be out any time of the day or night clearing roads, widening roadways or cleaning cul-de-sacs. At times, the plow drivers have limited visibility and may not see your children. Children playing in or near the snowbanks can be seriously injured or killed.

Garbage cans continue to be a problem on our road right of ways. If it is your collection day, make sure your garbage can and recycling bin are located on your property and off of the road right-of-way, which is typically 33 ft. from the center line. Placing your bins across the road from your driveway poses a hazard for traffic and creates difficulties during plowing operations. efforts more difficult. Thank you for you cooperation with these matters.

VISIBLE FIRE NUMBER SIGNS

For your own safety, please make sure your fire number signs are located near your driveway and are always visible to the roadway. Emergency personnel rely on these signs to expedite emergency services to you and your property. If you have relocated your sign away from the driveway, you are potentially lengthening the response time to an emergency. With heavy snowfall, it is easy for signs to become buried. 
